

Patricia Schnabel Ruppert, DO, MPH, CPE, DABFM, FAAFP is the Health Commissioner of Rockland County, a Clinical Assistant Professor of Medicine at Columbia University Medical Center, an Adjunct Professor of Public Health, New York Medical College, and a Fellows Ambassador at the New York Academy of Medicine.

She is an expert in a broad range of public health subjects, having written on influenza prevention, pandemic prevention and helping parents keep kids healthy. Dr. Ruppert is also Commissioner of Hospitals of Rockland County, New York. She serves on the Board of Directors of the NYS Public Health Association, the Alumni Board of Directors of the Columbia Mailman School of Public Health, the Board of Directors and as Medical Director of the Jan and Niles Davies Learning Center, the Professional Advisory Board and Graduate Advisory Committee of Dominican College and the Rockland County Licensed Home Care Services Agency.

Previously, Dr. Ruppert served as the President of the Medical Staff and Medical Director of Employee Health Services at Helen Hayes Hospital,

under the New York State Department of Health. She is a Fellow in the American Academy of Family Physicians and maintains her Diplomate status in the American Board of Family Medicine. She received her Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree from NY College of Osteopathic Medicine and her Executive MPH in Health Policy and Management from the Columbia Mailman School of Public Health, where she was a Macy Scholar. Dr. Ruppert is a Certified Physician Executive and has been inducted into Delta Omega, the Honorary Society in Public Health. In 2018-2019, she led her department through the largest measles outbreak in NY State since 1992 and the longest measles outbreak in the US since measles was eliminated in 2000.
