

Upcoming Pharmacy Gathering:






40th Reunion Celebration:





Pharmacy Alumni Scholarship Awarded

We are pleased to announce that the 2015-2016 recipient of the Taub Pharmacy Alumni Scholarship is Oscar JuanPierre Castro. Oscar is a second year student pursuing a Masters of Public Health degree in Epidemiology with a Certificate in Epidemiology of Chronic Diseases. Currently, Oscar is continuing his thesis work on the burden of cardiovascular disease in New York City over the past two decades. This past summer, Oscar travelled to Paris, France, for an internship in the Psychiatric Epidemiology field in which he studied the association between parental attitudes and parental demographic characteristics across seven countries in Europe. With an ultimate goal to study Medicine, the Epidemiology program will provide a concrete understanding of the underpinnings of Public Health while instructing Oscar in a technical and specialized science.
