EXTENCILLINE FOR SYPHILIS

Due to the Bicillin L-A shortage starting summer 2023, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) <u>announced</u> in January 2024 that **Extencilline** (benzathine benzylpenicillin injection, powder, for suspension) is now available as an alternative.

The preparation and administration of Extencilline differs from Bicillin L-A. Information about distribution and administration for healthcare providers is available <u>at this link</u>.

More information will be forthcoming, and we would be happy to assist clinics where possible with this process.

DECEMBER LC RECAP

December's LC focused on **Ending the STI Epidemic Through Prevention**, with a special focus on **doxyPEP**.

We discussed the rationale and evidence for doxyPEP, regimen, as well as clinical questions and possible risks of doxyPEP.

Most of the clinics participating in the LC had not yet implemented doxyPEP and were waiting for final CDC guidelines (draft guidelines available <u>here</u>). We did however discuss doxyPEP implementation, most notably who should be given doxyPEP.
