

INSTRUCTIONS: This form is to be used by graduate students registered in other schools of the University interested in Mailman School of Public Health courses. Each step must be followed to complete cross registration. Cross registrants are limited to 2 courses in total per semester. Mailman School students interested in cross-registering at other schools must use the Registration Adjustment Form.

1. Up to two courses within the same department can be requested on this form. Two courses from separate departments will require two form submissions.
2. Submit this form to the department offering the course to request permission and obtain the signature of the Academic Director/Department Representative.
3. Once signed, email the form to the Office of Student Affairs at msph-enrollment@cumc.columbia.edu to obtain the signature of an Enrollment Services team member.
4. Register for the course through your school of primary registration. Any changes, such as dropping the course, must also be made through your school.

NOTE: Courses at Mailman School of Public Health must be registered for letter grade or P/F.
