## INTER-PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION AT THE MAILMAN SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH

## The following activities are graduation requirements for entering Fall 2019 MPH and DrPH students:

- 1. Cohort 1 has been assigned to pilot the e-Intro to IPE experience which consists of an online "case" that students will follow and comment on for approximately 30 MINUTES A DAY, FOR ONE WEEK, during the fall semester. Each day of the week, students will engage (asynchronously) with an inter-professional team of students by answering prompt questions about the case. An inter-professional pair of faculty preceptors will monitor your progress and also comment on the case. *IF YOU ARE IN COHORT 1 YOU WILL RECEIVE MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THIS, INCLUDING COMPLETE INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION AND THE WEEK YOU ARE SCHEDULED TO DO SO.* Again this is a requirement only for Cohort 1.
- 2. Gun Violence Action Week (GVAW): will take place during the week of November 11<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and will include a number of activities throughout the week. Mailman's signature activity during this week will be the roll-out of a gun violence "case" during an in-person, interactive event to be held on November 14<sup>th</sup> in Alumni Auditorium during the early evening. The case will be presented by a panel of experts in the clinical and public health aspects of gun violence. Attendance at this case is <u>REQUIRED FOR COHORTS 2-4</u>, and optional for COHORT 1; more information is forthcoming. Other activities during GVAW are optional for all cohorts.
- 3. CUIMC "IPE" Day. The entire CUIMC campus will come together for one day of interprofessional workshops and activities. All daytime classes at all Schools are cancelled on this day, and participation in <u>at least 2 of the workshops is REQUIRED FOR ALL COHORTS</u> IPE Day will take place during the spring semester, and details are forthcoming.

There will be a number of other IPE offerings throughout the School year, including interactive "cases" that are sponsored by other Schools. <u>These are optional for Mailman students.</u>
